I was with my friends, but separate from them. I could smile and wave without a mask. I could share my prayer concerns with the Pastor as she went from car to car. I could sing out loud and not worry about spreading my germs. I could enjoy a sip of water (or coffee) and sneak a snack if I wanted to.

I'll admit I was not eager to worship this way. I longed to go "inside" and wear a mask as we spread out around the sanctuary. Now I see it different and I agree with the Pastor that our parking lot has become a holy place.

It's a place where we belong, together, yet apart. We can mask up and visit a bit after the service in a safe way. We can serve the community through our food pantry and prayer squares. We are still the Body of Christ. I thank the Lord for mornings such as this where I can safely worship with this community of believers!

## **Health Care Prayer Square Update**

Hopefully, you saw the great article in "The Blade" on 3/21, featuring a beautiful photo and interview with Louella!

We've delivered 225 prayer squares to St Luke's so far—3/4 of the way to our initial goal of 300. After Pastor Carol drops them off at the hospital, they are handed out personally during rounds, or administrators distribute them among their teams. Jill Trosin, V.P. of Administration, says they are greatly appreciated. When asked if she would like for us to continue past the 300 mark, she enthusiastically said, "Yes!"

## Instructions are simple:

- \* Make your squares approx. 5" x 5".
- \* Use yarn/fabric that can be machine washed and dried.
- \* Use any color or pattern you like.
- \* Pray for the person who will receive your square.
- \* Drop off squares in the basket on Sun. morning or in the kitchen, or in the Food Pantry storage box.

A large bag full of yarn was donated for the project. If you'd like to "shop" for some new yarn, the bag is on the kitchen counter.

renowned travel expert and author Rick Steves will join the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry (GBHEM) at 9:00 p.m., on Tues., 3/28, for a live online discussion about "Travel as a Spiritual Act."

Steves will share how his travels and experiences over more than 40 years of exploring off-the-beaten-path destinations throughout Europe have led to a greater understanding of diverse people and cultures. He will talk about the spiritual value of traveling and how you don't need to go to the other side of the world to see how travel transforms us, breaking down barriers and creating a more compassionate, empathetic world. "For those of us who believe in conversion, Rick's compelling, sophisticated travel narratives evoke questions that prompt us to look inward and assess our own prejudices and biases," says host Rev. Dr. Tamara K Gieselman.

#### **Holy Week and Easter**

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on 3/28, followed by Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and (on 4/4) Easter! We will hold our Maundy Thursday service in the parking lot on Thurs., 4/1, at 7 p.m. Bring your bread and juice for Communion. Our Good Friday observation will take a different turn this year. The sanctuary will offer some special "prayer stations," where you can spend some time in quiet reflection and prayer, accompanied by beautiful music recorded by Linda. It will be open throughout the day so that you can come when you can and stay as long as you like. Then, on 4/4, we'll celebrate Easter together in the parking lot. It's hard to believe that this will be the anniversary of our first parking lot service—a year that was full of adjustments and challenges but couldn't stop Zion from worshipping, learning, and serving together!

#### General Conference Postponed until 2022

General Conference has been rescheduled again and is now set for 8/29-9/6, 2022, in Minneapolis. Continuing travel restrictions, slow roll-out of vaccines in many countries, and lack of uniform access to technology made a virtual meeting of the global UMC impossible and necessitated the additional delay. A special one-day General Conference will be held on 5/8 to take care of ordinary business needed for the UMC to function until the regular Conference. No proposal to split the denomination will be addressed in May.
