Pastor Carol's Comments

There's a story in Acts (12:6-16) that always makes me laugh. Rhoda is a servant in the house of Mary, the mother of John Mark. The house is filled with people praying for Peter, who has been imprisoned by Herod. Unbeknownst to them, what they were praying for had happened—Peter had been freed with the help of an angel! Peter immediately went to Mary's house and knocked at the outer gate. Rhoda answered and, to her credit, recognized Peter by his voice through the closed gate. But then, Acts tells us, "She was so overjoyed that, instead of opening the gate, she ran in and announced that Peter was standing at the gate." Peter was left outside.

The people who had been praying for that very thing told Rhoda she was out of her mind. She insisted that he was out there. Finally, the people inside went out, found that Rhoda was right after all, and let Peter in.

Can't you just see this as an episode of "I Love Lucy"? I can. I laugh at Rhoda being so excited that she forgot the most important thing—to let Peter in. But I wonder how often we are like Rhoda, hearing a knock on the door and recognizing the voice on the other side, but failing to take the next crucial step of opening the door.

In Revelation we read, "Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking." When Jesus is trying to get our attention, we may hear him knocking and even recognize his voice. Maybe he's asking us to serve in a new way, or connect with someone we don't have much in common with, or grow deeper in our knowledge of Scripture. But, we don't follow through. We hear his voice, but we don't open the door.

It's by opening the door that we grow closer to Jesus. Revelation continues, "If you hear my voice *and open the door*, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me." It's when we act on what we hear that we have the opportunity to grow closer to Jesus.

Over the coming weeks, we'll be listening for Jesus' voice as we discern the direction our ministry at Zion will take. May we be blessed with ears that can hear, and with hearts that are willing to open the door.

A speaker at the Global Leadership Summit which Pastor Carol attended had this to say about change: you have to know what to continue and what to change. If you change what you should continue, you lose your identity. If you continue what you should change, you become irrelevant.

The past eighteen months have brought many changes to our ministry and to our congregation. The Administrative Council agreed that we need to take stock of the needs of the community and our resources to identify where we should focus our ongoing efforts to "love God, love people, and serve the world."

This needs to be a churchwide effort, and it will take some time. We will begin the process after worship on Sunday, 9/12. In a brief meeting, we will form some guidelines for how we want to approach this project and plan when we will hold future meetings. Together, we will decide how to continue what should continue and change what should be changed so that we may both maintain our identity as the Christian community called Zion and remain relevant in these days.

In-Person Bible Study Resumes!

After months of Bible Study on Zoom, we will again meet in-person for Bible Study, beginning Thursday, 9/16, at 6 p.m. We will use a 6-week video study called "The God We Can Know" by Rob Fuquay. We'll be exploring the "I Am" sayings of Jesus. The videos will take us on location in the Holy Land, where we will actually see the places where Jesus disclosed his true identity and the context in which he spoke each "I Am" saying.
