Pastor Carol's Comments

Why are we still singing Easter songs?!

Although we typically think of Easter as a day, it is actually one of the seasons of the Church, along with Advent, the Christmas season, the season after Epiphany, Lent, the Easter season, and the season after Pentecost. The Easter season begins on Easter Eve (after sundown) and lasts through Pentecost. The white paraments on the altar table, pulpit, and lectern are a visual reminder that our Easter celebration continues.

The period between Easter and Pentecost is called "The Great Fifty Days." During this time, we practice "living resurrection" in our own lives—we live as "Easter people," whose lives are shaped, not just by the cross, but by the resurrection of Jesus. As the noted preacher Barbara Brown Taylor wrote, it is in this season of resurrection that "followers became leaders, the listeners became preachers, the converts became missionaries, the healed became healers...and nothing was ever the same again." Easter is a season when we, too, can be transformed by the same power that raised Jesus from the dead.

In fact, our celebration of Easter doesn't end with Pentecost. Every Sunday is considered a "little Easter," in which we remember what Christ has done for us. As we recently sang, "Every day to us is Easter, with its resurrection song." During these fifty days and beyond, we look for signs and instances of resurrection in ourselves, in the Church, and in the world. We ask ourselves, what relationships that seem dead might

live again? What work that has fallen by the wayside might be revived? What in us that has become dormant can find new life?

John's gospel tells us that Jesus "was the light of all people...and the darkness did not overcome it." May the Light of the World continue to guide your days in this Easter season and beyond.

West Ohio Annual Conference

The West Ohio Annual Conference will meet in the Dayton Convention Center, 6/1-3. In addition to administrative tasks, a variety of resolutions will be voted on. The "Book of Reports," with detailed information about each resolution, hasn't been published yet, but the agenda lists topics such as Palestinian Christians, support for the creation of a US Conference, the removal of discriminatory policies, affirmation for full inclusion of all people in the UMC, and net zero greenhouse gas emissions. There is always lively debate about the proposed resolutions before they are voted on by the lay and clergy members of the conference. (Ron Myers is Zion's lay member, with Pat Jones as the alternate.)

Annual Conference also includes a variety of worship experiences, streamed online. More information about how you can participate virtually will be provided as it is announced.

West Ohio Conf. Suspends Residential Camping for 2023 West Ohio Conference has decided to suspend residential camp programs for the 2023 season.
